Series of winter talks kicks off with Carole King – behind the XC scenes

NOVEMBER will see the first in the club's series of winter talks with a great starter for the season.

'Behind the scenes cross country control and commentating' with speaker Carole King will be held for members on Thursday, November 21st at the Ridgeway, Smallridge, Axminster, 7pm for 7.30pm.

Carole has been a cross country controller for around 16 years and has led and been part of control teams at every level from grassroots through to Badminton, Blenheim and Chatsworth.

She regularly trains and mentors new cross country controllers, and has also controlled at pony, junior and young rider European competitions, including at Millstreet in Ireland.

Carole is also a level 3 show jump judge, which is the highest national level, and is currently level 1 on the international pathway. She has judged at many county shows, with her highlight being judging the Hickstead Derby.

In her 'spare time', Carole has also recently qualified as a level 1 FEI eventing steward.

The cost for the talk, including a two-course supper, will be £25 per person.

Arena support call

AS part of the club's ongoing focus to provide competitive training for our members we are looking at ways to support this.

The biggest cost is arena hire at some of the bigger venues. Whilst LCRC will continue to use those bigger venues for group lessons where arena space is paramount, members can help to significantly reduce the costs charged for flatworkbased training by allowing access to personal arenas, maybe once or twice a year.

They don't have to be huge arenas but consideration must be made to access and parking for up to 3-4 trailers/ lorries at a time as members come and go. If anyone would be willing to help the club in this way please get in touch with a committee member.

Club memberships

THE renewal time of year is around the corner and all LCRC members will be reminded that their annual membership is running out at intervals - 30 days, seven days and three days - prior to it lapsing with a link to renew.

Those who have chosen to auto-renewal will get a reminder seven days prior that their membership will be renewing automatically unless they wish to cancel it.

There will be a membership price increase from £30 to £35 for 2025 as British Riding Clubs has increased the amount it takes from each membership - from £24 to £25 per head starting in 2025.
